- Prevent unsafe acts or situations;

# STOP WORK AUTHORITY

## **USE OF TOOLS**

## MANUAL HANDLING

## CLEAR DECK

- ✓ Control hazards through task focused risk assessment.
- ✓ Be involved in task planning and voice any safety concerns.
- Assess any new risks if conditions change or the task procedures are modified.

### DON'T

- X Start a task without prior risk assessment and authorization.
- X Underestimate the potential risk in any task.
- X Hesitate to ask questions if you are not sure about any stage of task safety planning.

- ✓ STOP WORK for any unsafe act of condition.
- ✓ Raise questions when you feel unsure.
- ✓ Share your point of view with your co-workers Support and encourage STOP WORK culture with your co-workers.

- ✓ Adapt your body mechanics to the tool rating and avoid excessive repetitive motions.
- ✓ Use tools to the manufacturer's specifications and ensure they have no defects.
- ✓ Wear the correct PPE for the use of the tool.

- ✓ Use the appropriate PPE for the task.
- ✓ Wear a personal flotation device whenever reauired.
- ✓ Check the condition of PPE and report any damage. Remove damaged PPE from use.

- ✓ Minimize manual handling whenever possible.
- Ask for help when needed, and use mechanical means when appropriate.
- ✓ Check manual loads for sharp edges or other hazards; and keep your back straight and bend your legs when lifting and setting down loads.

## ✓ Keep clear of all suspended loads.

- ✓ Remain within designated areas until
- suspended loads are safe to approach.
- ✓ Ensure loads are securely slung and do check them for dropped object hazards.

## DON'T

- ✗ Hesitate to call a STOP WORK for any unsafe act of condition.
- X Continue a task if you're unsure about an uncontrolled risk.
- X Permit your co-workers to continue tasks when an unsafe act or condition is present.

## DON'T

- X Carry out any work if you do not have the right tools for the task.
- **X** Use a defective tool, or one in poor condition.
- X Ignore the operating procedure for tools and never exceed the design limits of tools.

### DON'T

- X Neglect wearing PPE for a job lasting 'a few minutes.
- X Perform work without wearing general or task-specific PPE.
- X Mistreat or misuse PPE.

## DON'T

- X Manually handle when the task can be conducted another way.
- **X** Forget about pinch-points and other hazards to hands and feet.
- X Use your back instead of your legs when lifting loads and don't twist or stretch your back when carrying loads.

## DON'T

- X Approach or walk under any suspended load.
- X Attempt to walk between a suspended load and a fixed object.
- X Start a task until communication is clearly established.

## ALCOHOL & DRUGS

- ✓ Maintain a zero approach to alcohol or drug use in the workplace or whenever likely to affect the safety of people.
- ✓ Represent yourself, your family and your Company with respectful and honorable behaviour.
- ✓ Do report to your supervisor anyone you know has or suspect have recently consumed alcohol or drugs.

## DON'T

- X Permit anyone to work if you know or suspect they have recently consumed alcohol or drugs.
- X Don't drive or operate any machinery under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- X Forget that side effects from prescribed drugs may increase the risk of accidents.



- ✓ Confirm risk control measures are communicated and understood.
- ✓ Ensure all people involved understand the permit to work conditions.
- ✓ Verify and maintain controls and isolations.

### DON'T

- X Enter any confined space until the atmosphere has been checked and verified safe.
- **✗** Enter any confined space until isolation and other controls have been verified safe.
- X Neglect emergency rescue training and preparation.



- ✓ Confirm risk control measures are communicated and understood.
- ✓ Ensure all people involved understand the permit to work and isolation/de-isolation plan conditions.
- ✓ Verify and maintain controls on isolations/de-isolations.

## DON'T

- X Start a task without prior risk assessment and authorization.
- ✗ Underestimate the potential risk in any task.
- X Hesitate to ask questions if you are not sure about any stage of task safety planning.



- ✓ Ensure all people involved understand the permit to work conditions.
- ✓ Ensure that working at height risk control measures are communicated and understood.
- ✓ Verify and maintain controls.

## DON'T

- **X** Work at height if there is a safer alternative
- **X** Work at height until a permit to work is issued and risk control measures are communicated and understood.
- X Neglect emergency rescue training and preparation.



- ✓ Ensure the need for change is justified and authorized.
- ✓ Confirm change risk control measures are communicated and implemented.
- ✔ Provide appropriate training for those responsible for making and implementing changes.

## DON'T

- **X** Make any operational, technical or organizational change without appropriate authorization.
- X Neglect to update plans and procedures accordingly.
- X Forget to re-assess risk mitigation if there are unexpected changes in the situation.



- ✓ Remember that reporting certain incidents is a legal requirement.
- ✓ Investigate incidents properly so that causes are identified and control measures put in place to prevent recurrence.
- ✓ Do follow up and ensure control measures are effectively implemented.

### DON'T

- X Forget that you must report all incidents in a timely and factual manner.
- X Fail to ensure control measures are effectively communicated and implemented.
- X Hesitate to report any concerns or suggest any improvement to continue enhancing safe operations.
