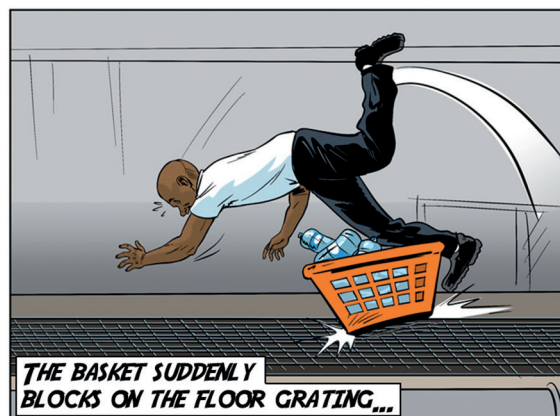
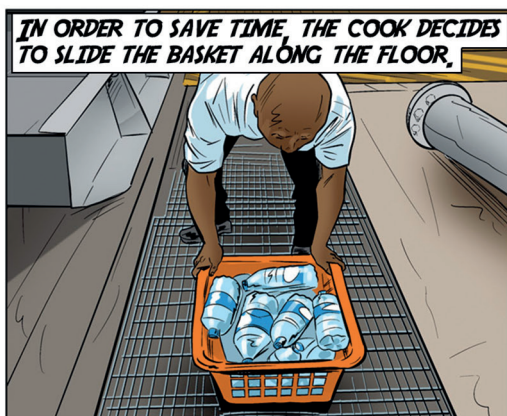
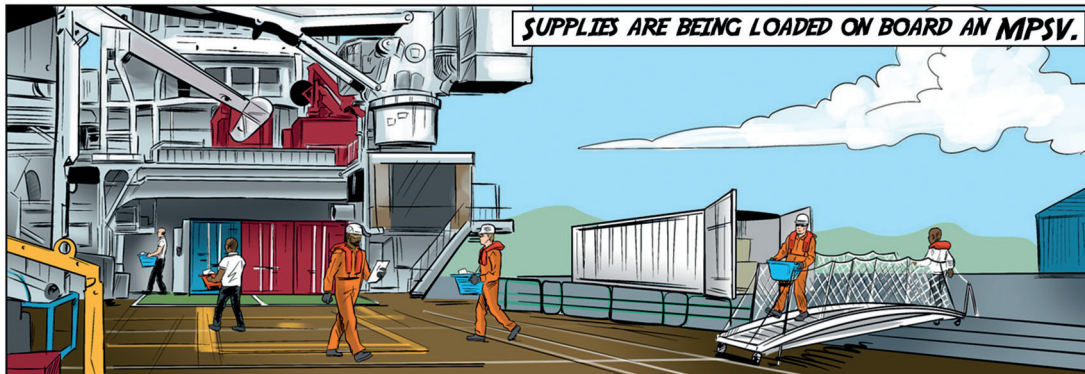


HASTE INCREASES RISKS

It can be tempting to start as soon as possible an operation that does not appear to present any risks. It is exactly in this type of situation that incidents happen! Underestimating risks and the lack of preparation and coordination are sources of incidents, as illustrated in the case presented in this safety post. Each operation, even when routine, must be carefully planned and coordinated. A well-prepared operation that respects safety procedures and is executed without haste is a successful operation. Stay alert!

LIFE SAVING RULES

DO:

- Plan each operation.
- Have the start of any operation validated by the bridge officers.
- Wear suitable personal protective equipment for the task.

DON'T:

- Act in haste.
- Start an operation without authorization.
- Take too many initiatives if you are new to the vessel.
