


DON'T NEGLECT CHANGE MANAGEMENT

Complacency with risk and the lack of task preparation can generate incidents, as the example below demonstrates. The lack of change management also led to a Near-miss that could have had very serious consequences for the crew. Thanks to the application of the Clear-deck policy during the operation, no seafarer was injured. This incident shows us that in matters of safety, we must never let our guard down.

LIFE SAVING RULES

DO:

- Inspect the deck conditions and lifting devices before the operations.
- Apply the clear-deck policy when the operation needs it.
- Ensure clear communication between crew members on deck and on the bridge.

DON'T:

- Use mooring equipment if its Safe Working Load (SWL) is not suitable for the operation.
- Accept any deviation from the deck cargo operation plan without further risk assessment.
- Start the operation without the escape zones having been identified by all people involved.
